Welcome

Welcome to East Fork's 2011 Training Plan! The document outlines our general plan and philosophy for training provided by East Fork Fire and Paramedic Districts.

The 2011 Year Plan includes a change that, at first sight, might make some members feel uneasy. We have not scheduled on a calendar the major classes that we have traditionally. These classes include firefighter-2, truck operator, and aircraft rescue firefighting among others. Our rationale is based on our combination system and attempting encourage more opportunity for volunteer and career members to train together.

East Fork will continue to offer these classes, as seen on the Quarterly Plan on pages 4 and 5. The difference is how the class is offered. We will provide the same class on various dates and times. This will allow career staff members in need of these classes to attend while on-duty, saving overtime funds. This will allow volunteer members to attend the date that is most convenient for them.

Providing classes in this fashion will enable us to hold the classes that we continually have to cancel due to low enrollment. It will increase the workload of the Training Captains as we develop the new format for these classes. We ask that you assist us in every means you can to ensure this method works for it is what will ensure all of our members receive the training necessary to answer the public's call.

You will notice we have scheduled the dates

for the volunteer academy, Class B driver and public CPR. These dates are as firmly set as possible. The dates for the other classes outlined on the Quarterly Training Plan are still up in the air as we develop the classes. They will occur in the quarter they are planned and we will provide 30-days notice prior to the class to ensure enrollment opportunity.

We have also scheduled 6 Saturday drill days for career and volunteer companies to get together and practice their skills.

As with much at East Fork, the training program is in a constant state of flux, changing to meet the ever changing needs of our organization. Our goal is to provide the best training.

Please take a moment to review this document and become more aware of the training we offer. Schedules for the major classes listed on the quarterly training plan will be announced on our website, via e-mail to Volunteer Chiefs and Career Staff and in our newsletter.

Quarterly Plan and Goal

The next page shows a table that outlines our training goals by major subject area. This table shows where we will focus the on-shift trainings and CEU programs in order to gain something of substance at the end of 2011. The Training Division will use this as a planning document when selecting on-shift training topics. Our goal is all classroom-training ties into a practical, skills based training. These practical skills based training include the quarterly multi-company drills, the monthly volunteer drills and additional on-shift trainings.

The “major classes” box indicates which major classes East Fork will hold in the on-shift format as discussed in the welcome message. Details on the dates, times and locations of these classes will be communicated 30-days prior to the class.

Level of Support

The level of support for each class varies within limits of our ever-fluctuating budget. This section outlines our intentions for support; management reserves the right to change this due to budgetary constraints. You must submit a training request for all trainings that request financial or material support from the district.

position task book for these classes. Each of these levels have multiple classes listed that meet the requirements. Contact the Deputy Chief of Training if you have questions on other classes that may apply to these requirements.

Leadership Excellence Challenge

This new program is sponsored by the Northern Nevada Fire Chiefs and University of Nevada at Reno. Look for further details on this program in the future.

National Fire Academy

Individuals who desire to attend the National Fire Academy must meet the course requirements prior to completing a training request. Time off is the responsibility of the individual. East Fork will support travel and the meal ticket. As the Fire Chief outlined in the budget memo, employees accepted into classes for fiscal year 2010/11 will continue to receive time off to honor the commitment the organization made when they entered the program.

Incline Paramedic Refresher

East Fork will support the paramedic refresher on the education track year . Overtime and coverage are not authorized.

Classes

Many classes are available for members to attend, including many of the California State technical rescue classes. Attendance maybe

supported by the District at various levels, depending upon the rationale given to attend and the direct benefit to the District.

Conferences

Attendance at a conference maybe supported by the District at various levels of support, based upon the rationale the individual gives to attend and the direct benefit to the District.

EMS Education

East Fork provides many CME classes to maintain State of Nevada certifications. 2011 holds the start of offering additional CME's to assist in maintaining National Registry certifications. For career staff, we will no longer provide for the CE Solutions website as we are providing 24-hours of CEU's annually.

While CME classes are designed to maintain certifications, there is no reason why other responders should not attend these classes in order to understand and anticipate needs on medical incidents.

EMT Basic

East Fork offers 12 3-hour EMT-Basic CME's per year. CME's are taught at Volunteer Stations, rotating between stations 5, 6 and 7 each quarter. Each class is split between a lecture and practical skills.

The Training Planning Group highly recommends a ride along for all EMT-Basics.

Volunteer EMT Intermediate

In a drastic change from past years, Volunteer EMT-I's will have to attend three different CME's and perform one 8-hour ride along annually to maintain their certification. Our Volunteer EMT-I's provided this recommendation during the 2010 refresher class. Each CME will include a lecture and skills practice. They will each be three-hours in length and have State CME credit. The ride along does not provide for CME credit but is a place for the EMT-I's to practice their skills.

Individuals who recently obtained their EMT-Intermediate must contact Captain Brawley for a copy of East Fork's protocols. You must pass a protocol and skills test after an ample amount of study time. Once successful with the exam, we will add you East Fork's permit and you can function as an EMT-I as long as you attend the quarterly refreshers.

Staff CME's

East Fork will provide two CME offerings each quarter. A Careflight nurse will instruct one offering per quarter and an in-house instructor will provide the second. Careflight dates and topics are selected and added to the calendar. We will record the Careflight CME offering; anyone may select to use the recording for credit. Our EMS Clinical Committee will select the in-house topics. We will add them to the calendar once selected. This will provide for 24-hours of on-shift CME credit.

Instructor Endorsement

You must teach 6-hours per 2-year certification cycle in order to maintain your instructor

endorsement. Those with EMS Instructor endorsements will be given first opportunity to instruct the CME offerings prior to bringing in new EMS instructors.

EMS Instruction time must be in a state-permitted course. We are working with various agencies around the state to reframe the EMS education criterion however that is the parameter within which we must work. Our desire is to be able to give CEU credit for the spur of the moment trainings that occur with ride alongs, new equipment and interns. Stay tuned for more.

East Fork offers around 80-hours of classes that require an EMS Instructor to teach, so there are plenty of opportunities for you to complete this State requirement.

Instructor and Student Expectations

Vision

The vision of our training program is to create a positive learning environment for our students with a paramilitary emphasis. What this means is we remember our role is to teach those that have never done our job how to do our job. We have to show, teach, reinforce and teach again. We will provide every means for the student to achieve competency.

Instructor Expectations

- Instructors will be on time and in appropriate uniform to all training classes;
- Treat the students and fellow instructors with dignity and respect. Do not forget our District values of: compassion, honesty, teamwork, dedication, commitment and professionalism. Students are internal customers, treat them as you would Mrs. Smith on incidents;

- Instructors will be in the same level of personal protective equipment (except for SCBA when in non-IDLH environments) as students;

curriculum used to ensure its relevancy and currency. Please provide objective feedback.

- Stop unsafe or non-tolerable acts (i.e. out of taste jokes, etc.) immediately;
- Use the accountability system (passports and helmet magnets) during practical skills to reinforce its incident use;
- Effectively manage training ground radio communications so students hear the correct terminology to use on incidents;
- Study the material you will teach before coming to class. We expect you to be well versed in your job of teaching the students;
- Instruct the East Fork and/or IFSTA material, not your own method;
- Ensure you are ready for physical activity by conducting pre-hydration prior to class;
- Check the students on a continuous basis for rehab needs;
- Follow all East Fork procedures, including our Uniform procedure;
- Recognize your role as an instructor: you are a mentor for the students. You are not their friend and you are not there to find fault.

It is expected that all instructors will follow this direction. All instructors owe it to the group to hold each of us to these expectations, regardless of rank. Failure to follow these expectations may result in your removal from future instructional opportunities; to raise the expectation bar of the student means we must also raise the expectation bar of the instructor.



Student Expectations


- Register with sufficient time to complete the pre-work;
- Cancel with sufficient time to allow for notifications;
- Come to class prepared to learn;
- Complete any pre-work prior to the first class offering;
- Be on time for class; call if you are running late;
- Hydrate for the class. Drink plenty of fluids before coming to class;
- Notify a Training Captain if you are on medication or have any injury, disability or limitations prior to class;
- Notify one of the Training Captains of any problems you may be experiencing with the course;
- East Fork Fire & Paramedic Policy and Procedures apply to all courses.

Not all students will pass. Your role as an instructor is to assist students in learning. The Training/Safety Captain's role is to determine final skill competency. We rely upon your objective feedback on students' skills, knowledge and abilities to make these decisions. We also need your feedback on the
